Students designed their own project and used the CAM Embroidery machine to add detail to their work.



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Year 11 Textiles Art Batik Material work

The Year 11 GCSE Textiles Art group produced some beautiful work in their 5-hour formal exam last term, when they were in Year 10. Inspired by artist Amiria Gale, they designed and made repeat patterns on fabric using the technique of Batik. This is a traditional Asian technique and involves using wax and then applying batik dyes onto fabric. Below are some examples of the work the students produced, which look amazing.

Yet as soon as they were born, they were torn from Mother's breast


I filled the lungs of future sighs, longing to see the moon Now in my water maw, they lie, stirred by ignorance's spoon
