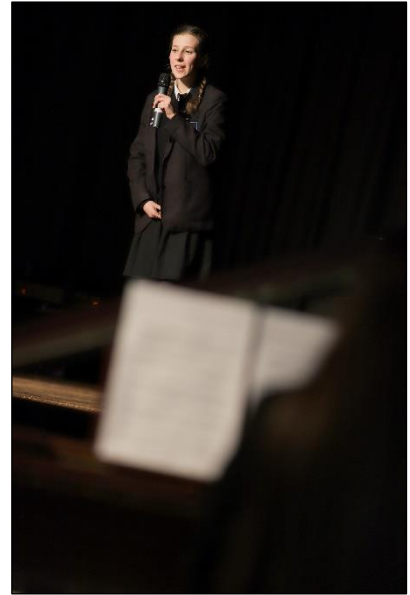
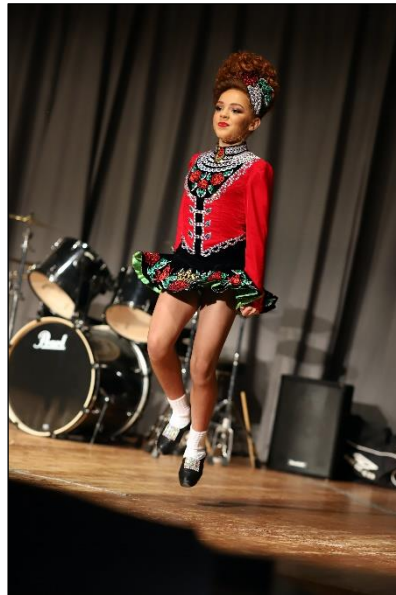

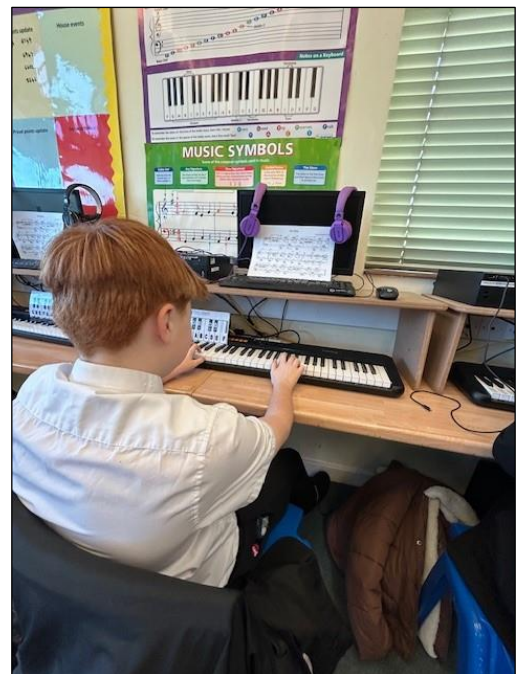


## KS3 Music at Alec Hunter

Key Stage 3 students have been working really hard in the Music department this term. **Year 7 and 8** students have been developing their piano skills and **Year 9 students** have been refining their guitar, ukulele, keyboard, voice and ensemble skills. Students in **Year 7** have been working on Independent Learning. This topic focuses on giving students all the musical tools they need to succeed, but it also has a strong emphasis on resilience and working things out for themselves. Their progress has been amazing and it's so good to see the pupils taking charge of their own learning, setting themselves targets and pushing themselves to achieve them.

**Year 8** students have been working on Beethoven's '*Für Elise*'. They have taken on the challenge of playing both hands together, practicing fearlessly and with outstanding results.

Students in **Year 9** have been learning the song '*Riptide*' by Vance Joy, a topic that requires them to play as part of an ensemble, but also spend time learning their own part. Many pupils have tried the guitar or ukulele for the first time. Well done to all the students who have been working so hard!





## Year 7 Castle Competition

The Castle Competition is an opportunity for students in Year 7 to get creative whilst also showing off what they have been learning in History about the purpose and development of castles in England. The students are invited to design a historically accurate castle, and we encouraged the students to use reusable/recyclable materials within their design. The 25 entries this year made 2024 one of our highest entry years to date. We also had a wide variety of materials used, from the traditional paper and cardboard, to Lego, foods and even online platforms such as Minecraft, Fortnite and Terraria.

Teachers within the Humanities department, the Year 7 team, as well as previous winners of the competition voted, and the results were as follows:

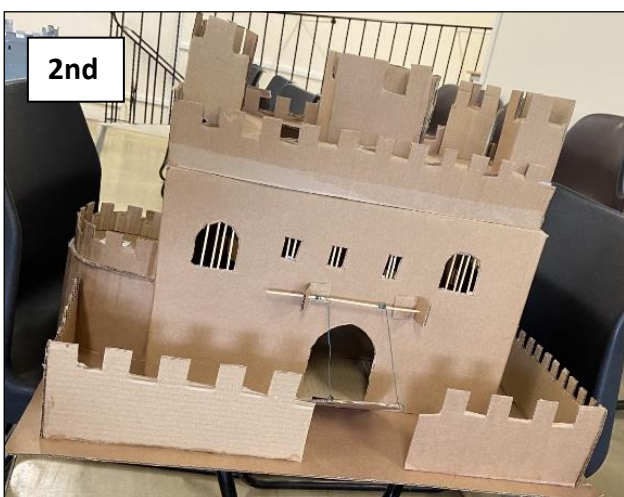
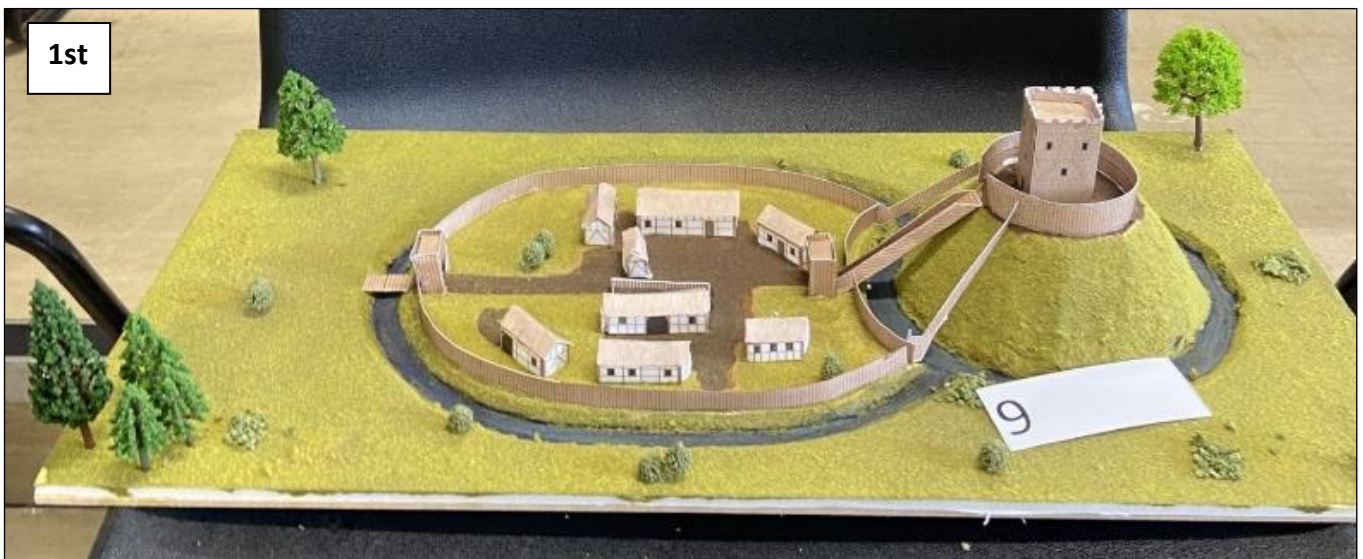
**1<sup>st</sup> Place = Harry Murr (Hawking)**
